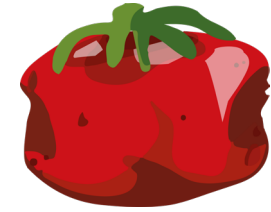

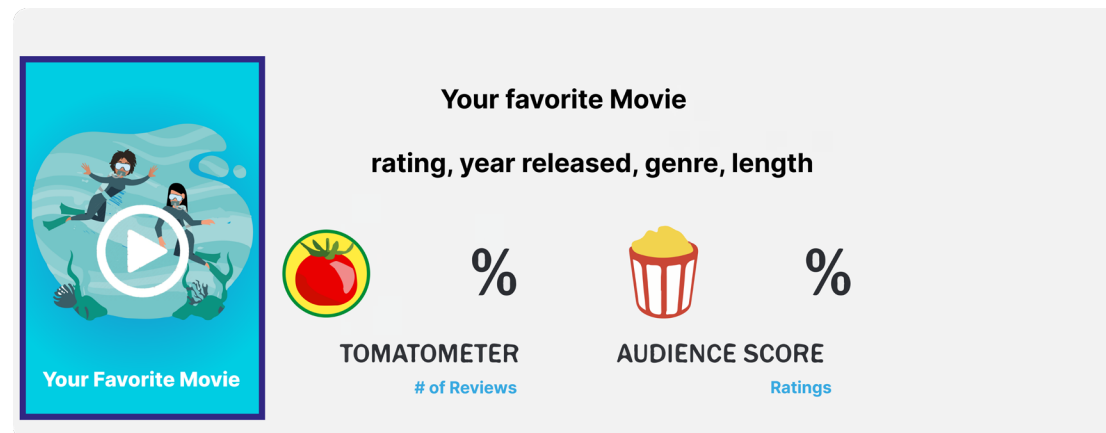

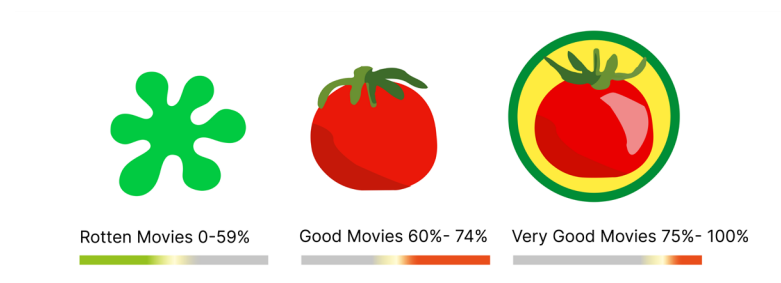
10. On a scale from **0%** (*worst movie ever*) to **100%** (*best movie ever*), what score would you give your favourite movie?
