

# **Step by Step Question Formation Chart (101)**

### Step by Step Questions

1. Is it an auxiliary, "be" or subject question?

2. What tense is it?

**3**. Is it a Yes/No or Information question?

**Auxiliary Questions:** The main verb in the answer is **NOT** the verb "be."

(e.g., He likes dogs.)

**Be Questions:** The main verb in the answer is "be."

(Yes, he is at home.)

**Subject Questions:** The subject in the answer is unknown.

(e.g. What happen? **Nothing** happened.

### **Be** Questions

Tense	Question	Verb "to be"	Subject	Rest of Sentence
Simple Present		am are is		
Simple Past		was were		

## **Subject Question**

Question	Verb	Rest of Sentence	
Who	wins	all the time?	Jane wins all the time.
How many people	were	at the party?	Over a hundred people were at the party.

#### Note

Present progressive, future and modal questions are always *auxiliary* questions even if the main verb is "be."
