Comparatives (compare two people or things)		
Rules		Comparative
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> one syllable adjectives 	Add er followed by than .	richer than rich
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> two-syllable adjectives ending in y 	Change the y to i and add er followed by than .	easier than easy
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> two or more syllable adjectives 	Add more or less before the adjective followed by than .	more exciting than exciting
Superlatives (compare more than two people or things)		
Rules		superlative
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> one syllable adjectives 	Add the before the adjective and est to the ending.	the richest rich
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> two-syllable adjectives ending in y 	Add the before the adjective and change the y to i and add est .	the easiest easy
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> two or more syllable adjectives 	Add the most or the least before the adjective.	most exciting exciting
Equatives (compare people or things that are equal in some way)		
Rule		Equative
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> all adjectives 	Add as before and after the adjective.	as exciting as exciting

bad	worse than	the worst
little	less than	the least
many	more than	the most
far	farther than	the farthest
