Three Types of Conditional Sentences

Meaning of the If clause	verb form in the If clause Condition	verb form in the main clause Result	Example			
First Conditional true in the present/ future	simple present	simple present OR simple future	If I	today, I(<mark>not</mark>)	tomorrow.	
Second Conditional untrue in the present/future	simple past	would + simple verb form	If I	today, I (not)	tomorrow.	
Third Conditional untrue in the past	past perfect (had + past participle)	would have + past participle	If I	today, I (<mark>not</mark>)	yesterday.


