

Present Progressive Tense – Spelling	2
Add <i>ing</i> to most verbs.	
If the verb ends in <i>e</i> , remove the <i>e</i> and add <i>ing</i> .	
If a verb ends in <i>ie</i> change the <i>ie</i> to <i>y</i> and add <i>ing</i> .	
If the verb is one syllable and ends in <i>consonant- vowel- consonant</i> double last consonant and add <i>ing.</i> <i>Except</i> if the verb ends in <i>x or w</i> .	
If a verb is more than one syllable and ends in <i>consonant- vowel- consonant</i> and the <i>stress</i> is on the last syllable, double the last consonant.	
Don't double the consonant of a multi-syllable word if the last syllable is not stressed, just add ing.	
	Add ing to most verbs. If the verb ends in e, remove the e and add ing. If a verb ends in ie change the ie to y and add ing. If the verb is one syllable and ends in consonant- vowel- consonant double last consonant and add ing. Except if the verb ends in x or w. If a verb is more than one syllable and ends in consonant- vowel- consonant and the stress is on the last syllable, double the last consonant.

Auxiliany Questions

- 3. Is it a yes/no question or an information question?
 - Now, use the appropriate chart to help you.

 Auxiliary Questions:
 The main verb in the answer is NOT the verb "be."

 (e.g., He likes dogs.)

 Be Questions:
 The main verb in the answer is "be."

 (e.g., Yes, he is at home.)
