**EXERCISE 2:** Match the sentences from Exercise 1 with their past progressive use in the chart below. Just write the number of the sentence.

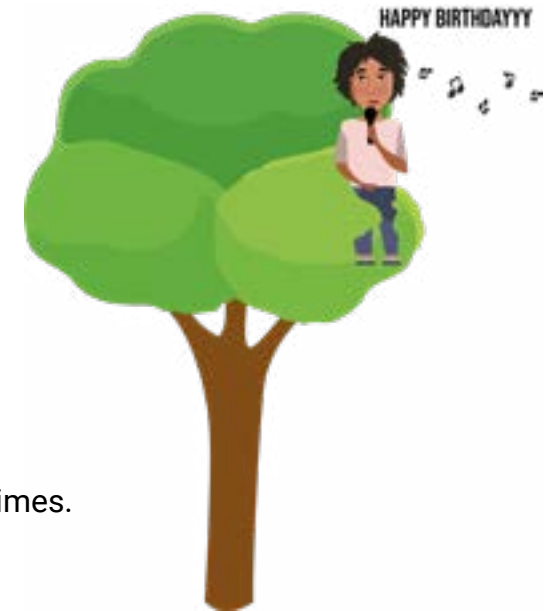

**EXERCISE 5:** What were they doing when you came to the party? Look at the picture for one full minute. Then, move the picture away and describe the scene using **the past progressive**.

**Example:** *The cat was sleeping when I came in.*

Simple Past versus Past Progressive - Use		
Tense	Example	Use
Simple Past	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I <b>watched</b> a movie <b>yesterday</b>.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>used to describe actions that began and ended at a specific time.</li> </ul>
Past Progressive	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I <b>was watching</b> a movie at 9:30 last night.</li> <li>I <b>was watching</b> a movie when the power <b>went off</b>. (long action) (short action)</li> <li>While I <b>was watching</b> a movie, I <b>was doing</b> my homework. (long action) (long action)</li> </ol>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>used to describe an action that was in progress at a specific time in the past</li> <li>used to describe an action that was in progress at the time of another action</li> <li>used to talk about two actions in progress at the same time in the past.</li> </ul>
