

### TUTORING ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE: SIMPLE PAST versus PAST PROGRESSIVE

TIP

Tense	Example	Use	
Simple Past	I watched a movie yesterday.	<ul> <li>used to describe actions that began and ended at a specific time.</li> </ul>	
Past Progressive	1. I was watching a movie at 9:30 last night.	<ul> <li>used to describe an action that was in progress at a specific time in the past</li> </ul>	
	2. I was watching a movie when the power went off. (long action) (short action)	<ul> <li>used to describe an action that was in progress at the time of another action</li> </ul>	
	<ol> <li>While I was watching a movie, I was doing my homework. (long action) (long action)</li> </ol>	<ul> <li>used to talk about two actions in progress at the same time in the past.</li> </ul>
